




Existing System

- Over 40 park sites
- Over **5,000** acres of park
 - Clear Creek Heritage Center accounts for approx. 3,000 acres
- 47% of residents live within a 10-minute walk to a park
- Over 50 miles of trail

*Inventory is ongoing



Park Classifications: Regional Parks

- Parks with significant land area
- Draw visitors from across the region

Ex: Clear Creek Natural Heritage Center



Park Classifications: City Parks

- Large parks
- Draw residents from across the City
- Locations for citywide events

Ex: Quakertown Park



Park Classifications: Community Parks

- Large park
- Serve multiple neighborhoods
- Provides a wide range of amenities and recreational activities

Ex: Mack Park



Park Classifications: Neighborhood Parks

- Smaller park
- Serve the adjacent neighborhood
- Typically provides play equipment, open space, and seating areas
- Ex: Fred Moore Park



Park Classifications: Pocket Parks

- Very small park
- Minimal formal amenities
- Intended to provide pocket of green space

Ex: Industrial Park



Park Classifications: *Linear Parks*

- Linear stretch of open space
- Usually runs along a drainage corridor, utility easement, or body of water
- Often have trails

Ex: Cooper Creek Linear Park



Park Classifications: Special Use Parks

- Serve a special or unique purpose
- Draw visitors from a large area

Ex: Skate Works Park




Park Classifications: *Preserves*

- Area of land that is maintained in its natural state
- Typically has important natural features or features of special interest
- Meant for passive recreational use


Ex: Mayhill Preserve


