


City Utilities Role and Responsibility

- Proposed Connection Option
 - Alignment along Hardaway Road

Alternative 1 - Utility Easement and Water line along Hardaway Road


- Hardaway Road South is a private road that is still owned by the Hardaway Family
- Considerable effort required to:
 - Research and find the existing Heirs of the family
 - Negotiate the easement with the owner/s
 - Obtain the easement from the owner/s
 - If no heirs are found, owners responsible for seeking legal remedies
- Approximate Timeline 6 to 12 months
- Approximate Cost to the residents for extending water line - \$105,000
- This cost does not include city fees





Alternative 2 - Utility Easement and Water line West of Hardaway Road


- Easement acquisition/dedication from multiple owners
- Meters set along the western edge of Hardaway Road
- Approximate Timeline 4 to 8 months
- Expected Cost to the residents for extending water line - \$51,000
- This cost does not include city fees





Alternative 3 - Utility Easement and Water line East of Hardaway Road


- Easement acquisition/dedication from one owner
- Meters set along the eastern edge of Hardaway Road
- Approximate Timeline 2 to 4 months
- Approximate Cost for extending water line - \$33,000
- This cost does not include city fees





Alternative 4A/4B – Meter and meter vault on Riney Road

- 4A Set meter header on Riney Road.
 - Each resident will have a meter and all meters will be managed individually
- 4B Set master meter on Riney Road.
 - Single meter managed by a single property owner
- Private plumber will make connection
- No Easement acquisition
- Meters set along Riney Road
- Owners extend private water lines to their properties at their own expense (Unknown)
- Approximate Timeline 2 weeks
- Approximate Cost for **extending** water line \$0





Summary

	Timeline	Total Implementation Cost	Cost per Connection/Owner*
Alternative 1	6 - 12 months	105,000	23,157
Alternative 2	4 - 8 months	51,000	14,157
Alternative 3	2 - 4 months	33,000	11,157
Alternative 4	2 weeks	0	5,657



^{*} Assumes <u>6</u> Connections/Owners

^{*} Does not include cost of private service line connecting house to meter

Proposed Water Line – Next Steps

- Step 1 Community decides which option they would like to pursue
- Step 2 City will schedule follow up meeting in June
- Step 3 City refines costs based on commitments
- Step 4 Property owners pay connection costs
- Step 5 City begins construction work, if:
 - All costs are paid by all committed property owners
 - Easement (if required) is secured



City of Denton Reminders

- Hardaway Road is privately owned
- The residents are responsible for any cost associated with extending the water line
- The residents are responsible for any issues that may arise
- The path forward must be collectively decided amongst Hardaway Road residents
- The City can only implement one alternative
