Background/Why We Are Here

- Lido Way and Balboa Court are both being reconstructed as part of the 2019 Residential Street Reconstruction Package
 - Construction will start 7/20
- Both streets lack an outlet and end in cul-de-sacs which presents a challenge in detouring traffic
- During construction, both streets will handle two directions of traffic on a single lane
- This discussion is being held to add clarification to the traffic pattern

Construction PH I

- Work-Flow
 - Driveway & curb section replacement on both sides
 - 7/21 8/12
 - Pavement replacement PH I
 - 8/13 8/25
 - Pavement replacement PH II
 - 8/27 9/14
 - Highlighted areas show planned areas widened for passing
- Approximate timeline of 1 month for full lane shutdowns



Construction PH II

- This is the most efficient method for replacing the road on these streets
- Recommendations
 - Travel slowly in open lane
 - Person nearest a widened area or convenient pull-out should yield
 - Have patience both with workers and neighbors
 - Reach out ASAP if issues arise
