



#### What is Recycling?

Recycling is defined as the process of converting waste materials into new materials and objects

### Why is Recycling important?

- Reduces landfilling, conserves landfill space
- Conserves resources
- Saves energy
- Creates job

#### What is contamination?

- Any item that is non-programmatic and can affect other recyclables that it is grouped with
  - · Liquids, grease, Styrofoam, donation items
- Recyclables that have been contaminated can no longer be processed, and instead pose a further risk to other recyclables. This can mean that entire bins of valuable recycling can be diverted to the landfill.

#### What can contamination do?

- Degrade quality
- Contaminate other recyclables
- Safety concern
  - **Cause Fires**
  - ► Harm employees
  - Damage machinery
