## 4. PUBLIC HEARINGS:

A. Hold a public hearing and consider making a recommendation to City Council regarding a request by Bomac Denton Investments, LLC for a Specific Use Permit to allow for a multi-family use. The 12.37-acre site is generally located on the east side of Brinker Road, approximately 990 feet south of South Loop 288 in the City of Denton, Denton County, Texas. (S17-0007, Enclave at Denton, Hayley Zagurski).

Chair Rozell opened the Public Hearing. Hayley Zagurski, Senior Planner, presented the request. She stated staff recommends approval of the request based on conditions.

The following individuals spoke during the Public Hearing:

Kim McKibben, 1306 W. Hickory Street, Denton, Texas, spoke in opposition. She stated she is concerned with the Environmentally Sensitive Area (ESA) that is adjacent to the property. The parking lot and other adjustments could be made to avoid the tiny ESA on the site. She questioned if there is any protection for the ESA.

Chair Rozell stated the retaining wall would be located outside of the ESA.

Kenneth Sambro, applicant, 317 Ed Burr Court, Southlake, Texas, spoke in support of this request. He stated he doesn't have a presentation but is available for questions. He provided clarification regarding the ESA and what was removed for the retaining wall. He stated that amount of the ESA was not counted in the required amount.

Commissioner Beck questioned if the buildings would each have an elevator. Sambro confirmed.

Commissioner Smith questioned if there would be dedicated parking for the commercial uses. Burling confirmed, the tenants will have assigned parking spaces and then designated spaces for the commercial uses.

Chair Rozell questioned the cap on the building height. Sambro stated it would conflict with the parking requirements if it were to increase. Sambro stated the detention pond does have a shared agreement with Wal-Mart.

There was no one else to speak, Chair Rozell closed the Public Hearing.

Commissioner Tim Smith motioned, Commissioner Larry Beck seconded to approve the request based on staff's condition: 1. The provided preliminary site plan, landscape plan, and building elevations are generally consistent with the requirements of the Denton Development Code in terms of site design, landscaping, parking, and building design as provided in DDC 35.6.3. The final site plan, landscape plan, and building elevations shall be consistent with the approved preliminary plans and elevations. **Motion approved** (7-0). C. Hold a public hearing and consider making a recommendation to City Council regarding a request by Johnathan Burling and Alexis Kuhn for an initial zoning of Neighborhood Residential 1 (NR-1) District. The 1-acre site is generally located on the north side of Shiloh Lane, approximately 910 feet east of Swisher Road, in the City of Denton, Denton County, Texas. (Z18-0016, Burling Kuhn Addition, Julie Wyatt).
