## **CONSENT AGENDA**

**A. PUB16-046** - Consider recommending approval of amending the Pecan Creek Water Reclamation Plant process model contract with Hazen and Sawyer engineers for additional testing and optimization of the ferric feed for phosphorous removal, and the rehabilitation of the existing Raw Wastewater Pump Station Number 2 to add \$124,650 to the contract for a total amount of the amended contract not to exceed \$282,175.

Board Member Russell pulled this item for more information. P.S. Arora gave an overview of the project that included testing for phosphorus and calculations to the model.

Board Member Russell motioned to approve item A with a second by Board Member Carroll, Vote 6-0 approved.

- **B. PUB16-048** Consider recommending adoption of an ordinance of the City of Denton authorizing the City Manager or his designee to execute a contract through the Houston-Galveston Area Cooperative Purchasing Network for the acquisition of one (1) Backhus model A60 compost turner for the City of Denton Beneficial Reuse Department; and providing an effective date (File 6077-awarded to Ecoverse in the amount of \$463,693).
- C. PUB16-050 Consider recommending approval of an amendment to the annual concrete repair and installation services contract with Floyd Smith Concrete, Inc (Contract #5241) to add \$475,000 for reconstruction of two road segments at the Pecan Creek Water Reclamation Plant for an amended contract amount of \$10,475,000.
- **D. PUB16-052** Consider recommending retroactive confirmation and approval of "Declaration of an Emergency" and associated cost for the emergency repair of a 27 inch potable water transmission main to Forterra Pipeline Services, Grand Prairie, Texas in the amount of \$57,378.00. (File 6061)

Board Member Gallivan motioned to approve items B, C, and D with a second by Board Member Parker, Vote 6-0 approved.

**B. PUB16-051 -** Receive a report, hold a discussion and consider recommending retroactive confirmation and approval of a "Declaration of an Emergency" and associated cost in the amount of \$345,658.25 for the replacement of the 2.0 Million Gallon McKenna Park water storage tank roof to Pittsburg Tank and Tower Company, Incorporated.

Tim Fisher gave an overview of the emergency project that included a timeline of the events and photographs.

Carroll asked if the roof had structural issues where the rafters were rusting out. Fisher answered there were some but not much. There are holes were the Cathodic Protection System is mounted. One of the photographs show the holes, they are not rusted out that is where the system hangs from the roof. They are sealed with a caulking system.

Carroll asked if the tank is empty currently. Fisher answered it has been put back in service temporarily.

Bynum asked how old is the tank. Fisher answered it was installed in 1951. Bynum asked how long is projected use for the tank. Fisher answered steal tanks are from 50 to 100 years depending on the maintenance. It is currently 65 years old, the sidewalls and the floor have heavy steal and are in decent shape.

Gallivan asked if there is an inspection process every five years, the pictures look very bad. Fisher answered those tanks are inspected with a pull down inspection approximately every five years. The rafters themselves are 70 feet from the bottom and there isn't a good way to inspect them.

Bynum asked, it is about half a million to replace the roof, how much to replace the entire tank. Fisher answered it would be around two to three million dollars.

Robinson asked if it is the oldest tank in use. Fisher answered yes it was built in 1969. The next one at Roselawn was built in 2003.

Russell asked when something like this happens, does staff look at repairs versus replacement to see if this is money well spent. Fisher answered as a tank gets older it is good practice to pull down inspections and a professional assessment and weigh the economics. In this case that was not done. The rafter system had the issues.

Bynum stated with the repairs the life could be extended extensively. Fisher answered with a new roof and repainting the system the life will easily be extended 25 years.

# Board Member Russell motioned to approve item B with a second by Board Member Bynum, Vote 6-0 approved.
