3. PUBLIC HEARINGS

A. AA22-0002: Hold a public hearing and consider an appeal of an administrative decision regarding the interpretation of the Definition for an Automotive Repair Shop, Minor, for a property located at 709 South Elm Street. The approximately 0.26-acre property is located on the east side of South Elm, approximately 75 feet south of Maple Street in the City of Denton, Denton County, Texas. (AA22-0002, Tint World, Julie Wyatt)

Chair Briggle opened the public hearing at 5:41 p.m.

Julie Wyatt, Senior Planner, presented the item and a discussion followed.

Jeff Stark, Chief Operating Officer of Tint World, spoke on the item.

John Withers, 9501 David Fort Rd. Argyle, TX 76226, Property Partner, spoke on the item.

Brent Pounders, 1310 Circle J Trl Prosper, TX 75078, Franchise Owner of location, spoke on the item.

Tina Firgens, Deputy Director of Development Services/Planning Director, spoke on the item and explained the difference between automotive repair minor and automotive repair major. Firgens also went over codes, application processes, City Council policies and applicable procedures, and State Law requirements staff has to follow.

Jeff Stark, Applicant, spoke on the item and addressed that the category that staff provided for his business is not correct based on the services they provide. Stark explained not all stores offer the same services. 13% of 100 stores are in traditional automotive spaces, with no modifications needed to the building. 12% of the stores have needed a Specific Use Permit (SUP) to get approved, mostly to convert buildings for automotive spaces because they have been a retail strip center with no overhead doors to bring in vehicles to provide services.

Stark mentioned that they think the SUP should not be required based on the services they plan to provide. The services they provide are auto detailing (tinting, paint protection films/wraps, audio/electronics-quick replacement/repairs). Customers would also be able to purchase products and take home to apply to vehicles. The cost of the SUP and the process is longer in the City of Denton than anywhere else.

Member Njoku, inquired to determine what classification for their business are they wanting. Stark mentioned retail but indicated he does not have much knowledge of the codes or other classifications Tint World could fall under. Stark added he is appealing the administrative decision because the current category staff provided for his business, which is automotive repair minor, does not apply at all to the business they conduct.

Chair Briggle inquired if the use is upheld or does not get 6 votes, will a SUP be required? Yes, it will.

Chair Briggle closed the public hearing at 6:46 p.m.

Chair Lane suggested staff review and look into amending the DDC to clarify uses and to help possibly avoid SUP's, and also remove "repair" for business similar to this application.
