28 29	Chair John Ryan motioned, Mayor Chris Watts seconded to approve the July 5, 2019 meeting minutes. Unanimous vote, no denials. Chair John Ryan stated motion passed.
30 31 32 33 34 35	Ron Menguita, Principal Planner, reviewed House Bill 2439 and explained it relates to regulations for products, materials, or methods used in the construction or renovation of buildings. Menguita explained the Bill will take effect on September 1, 2019. Committee discussed House Bill 3167 and discussed the municipal approval procedures for land development and applications. Menguita explained House Bill 3167 refers to processes and the time frame the city has to review and act on applications.
36 37 38 39 40 41 42	Menguita discussed City Initiated Rezoning's and explained the second group of rezoning's will be presented to Council on July 23, 2019, and the third group will be presented to Planning & Zoning early August. Committee agrees with staff to continue reviewing recommendations. Menguita stated in group 3 we have identified compatibility areas around Teasley, U.S. Highway 377, and the neighborhood around The Universities. Group 3 includes about 191 parcels in total. Menguita explained due to the bills passed certain building materials wouldn't be enforceable. Menguita presented the draft zoning map and discussed that due to square footages and setbacks of properties in HC (highway corridor) zonings, MR (mixed-use regional) MN (mixed-use

- neighborhood) certain areas will change in order to be conforming to each zoning district.
- 2 Individual parcels were discussed. Recommendations were to modify the code to read, if
- 3 something has natural damage and is less than 50 percent, but it's restored exactly to how it used
- 4 to be before the new code transition, you don't require an SUP. It will be non-conforming in the
- 5 new transition, but was in the old code, therefore, the same use will be allowed. If individual
- 6 properties had a conforming legal use before transition of the new code, they should have an
- 7 exception and consider the individual parcels to be conforming. Committee and staff will review
- 8 all of group 2 and 3 before it is brought forward to either P&Z or council.
- 9 Committee and staff members discussed accessory dwellings and decided to have another work
- session. Menguita mentioned accessory dwellings need to be reviewed to decide whether it will
- be part of an existing building and how addressing will be resolved.
- 12 Menguita discussed staff will continue to provide draft code amendments. Some of the
- amendments being considered are short-term rentals, mobile food courts, and accessory food
- 14 dwellings.
- 15 There was no further discussion. Chair John Ryan adjourned the meeting at 1:02 p.m.
