Council Member Armintor presented a friendly amendment to Council Member Davis' motion to have the developer outline in the PD where the construction routes would be located and hold them to it legally. Council Member Davis found the friendly amendment to have merit but did not accept it since clarification was provided that for any construction project, a private developer has to identify where the construction entrances/routes will be located; and if traffic deviates, the City has the ability to stop construction until the issue is corrected.

Discussion continued.

The applicant, Jim Strange, stated he accepted the proposed amendments regarding the conservation easement, tree placement and proposed concept plan.

Council Member Ryan presented a friendly amendment to require the construction ingress and egress be off Ryan Road. Council Member Davis accepted the friendly amendment and revised his original motion as follows:

- Adopt the draft ordinance as presented with the agenda backup material;
- Add that the construction entrance be from Ryan Road; and
- Substitute Exhibit D, as updated and provided during the meeting, to include staff recommendations for Section 5 which include the conservation easement and buffer tree zone on the southwestern corner

Amended motion seconded by Council Member Ryan.

Discussion continued.

The meeting was recessed to allow staff to review the impact of the amended motion at 9:54 p.m. and reconvened at 9:56 p.m.

Staff reported the developer would be required to go to the Zoning Board of Adjustment as to the crash gate and request a variance, then return to City Council for final approval.

Discussion continued.

Council Member Briggs moved a substitute motion to postpone the item until a full quorum of the City Council was present. Motion died due to lack of a second.

Discussion continued.

Mayor Watts moved a friendly amendment to Council Member Davis' amended motion to provide that after building Monte Carlo Street, the developer construct a moveable barricade across Monte Carlo Street at the southern edge of the property. Council Member Davis accepted the friendly amendment, as did Council Member Ryan who had seconded the amended motion.

Mayor Watts called the vote on Council Member Davis' amended motion, as further modified by the accepted friendly amendment, and seconded by Council Member Ryan to:

• Approve the requested rezoning to Planned Development (PD) District, including the PD Standards and PD Development Plan Map, with the following conditions:

- 1. The construction entrance for the development of the property shall be designated directly along Ryan Road.
- 2. The PD Development Plan Map shall be the revised plan provided in hard copy to the City Council at the December 17, 2019 public hearing rather than the plan originally submitted as part of the December 17, 2019 agenda.
- 3. Section 5 of the PD Development Standards shall be revised to reflect:
 - a. Conservation easements for tree preservation areas as shown on the Concept Plan shall be provided at the time of platting and benefit the HOA and
 - b. Buffer trees are required to be planted at a rate of 1 tree per 50 linear feet in the southwestern portion of the buffer behind the lots on Street D of the PD Development Plan Map.
- 4. An emergency-access-only gate shall be installed at the southern-most connection to Monte Carlo Lane abutting the Ridgemont Addition. Monte Carlo Lane shall be fully improved underneath the gate to allow for emergency access and utility connections.
